Great Britain Security and Quality of Supply Standard (GB SQSS) Review for onshore intermittent generation

Industry Workshop
21st August 2007, Birmingham

Abstract

Since the last industry workshop on the GB SQSS review for onshore intermittent generation in May, the working group has been working on the GB SQSS principles with the DTI Centre for Distributed Generation and Sustainable Electrical Energy (DG&SEE) and TNEI Services Limited in partnership with the University of Strathclyde.

During the discussions session at the last workshop, the working group noted that the level of engagement in the discussions could have been better if the audience had prior knowledge of the GB SQSS principles as well as the application of the standard in the design of the Main Interconnected Transmission System (MITS). The working group has therefore decided to hold another industry workshop prior to the consultation in order to provide participants with the opportunity to consolidate their understanding of the underlying concepts behind the GB SQSS. This opportunity will also allow the participants to debate and comment on the current proposals. It will help them in responding to the consultation document when it is published. According to the revised work programme, the consultation document on the GB SQSS principles will be published late August.

The working group acknowledges that the GB SQSS plays an important role towards the attainment of the GB renewable targets. To that end, the working group, through these workshops, aims to make the review of the GB SQSS an open and transparent process. In order to encourage as much participation as possible, attendance at the workshop is FREE OF CHARGE.

Although this workshop is a direct follow up to the first one held in May, it is equally suitable for interested persons who did not get the opportunity to attend the first one.
