

## **GIS Working Group - Meeting 4 – 27<sup>th</sup> January 2009 - Update on Actions**

### **Action 73 – Worked charging examples**

#### **For discussion**

#### **Generator connections**

For generation connections it is not possible for National Grid licenced business to undertake worked examples as National Grid do not have access to such cost information. This information is between the generator and their contractor (if the contractor is National Grid this would be with the unlicenced business and such information can not be shared with the licenced business).

However, it would be possible if a generator was willing to share costs with National Grid for a historic project which could be anonymised and shared with the group.

#### **DNO connections**

National Grid has attempted to undertake this analysis but does not have access to the necessary historical data. Data is provided in the Fixed asset confirmation certificates (FACC's) and full details of these for connection and infrastructure were not required pre PLUGS for charging purposes. Charging only received the total cost with no breakdown into component parts.

Post PLUGS this information should be available. However, National Grid does not have a fully outturned project with complete data at this point in time where National Grid have the full suite of connection and infrastructure FACCs.

National Grid will continue to investigate other possibilities to undertake such analysis. However, it should be noted that no other charges have cost estimates within the charging methodologies and as with all National Grid costs, they have to be economic and efficient to ensure compliance with the licence.
