

## Fast Reserve

### Market Report of Tenders received for provision of service from March 2010

The Fast Reserve service was established by National Grid on 1 August 2001. Further details on this service can be obtained from our industry website at:

To be eligible to participate, all potential Service Providers are required to fulfil a pre-qualification process to demonstrate their capability to meet the service criteria. Upon successful fulfilment of this, terms for the provision of Fast Reserve are drawn up which establish the relevant Fast Reserve parameters and a fee for the provision of an optional service. In addition, these same terms permit the Service Provider to tender for a firm service in accordance with the timetable of the monthly tender process, which is set out in the terms.

Since October 2004, new changes were made to the Fast Reserve Tender that increases the flexibility for providers in an attempt to facilitate competition and enhance the existing process. To reiterate the changes as set out on the website, the changes are as follows:

- You may now tender for a Firm Fast Reserve Period covering a period of consecutive calendar months, if desired, rather than simply a calendar month.
- You now have the opportunity to aggregate more than one unit at station to meet a required deliverability of 50MW at an aggregated unit (the minimum 50MW still applies for single BM units). This facility allows stations that are comprised of a number of smaller BM units that would not otherwise meet the required deliverability, the opportunity to submit a tender.

Highlights of the tender round for a firm service from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2010 are as follows:

- On 27<sup>th</sup> January 2010 National Grid published (on its industry website) indicative requirements for the Fast Reserve service for the month of March 2010.
- One new multi month tender was received – this tender was rejected.
- Please note that the details of the other tenders for this month are long-term tenders that were previously accepted or rejected for the period up to 29<sup>th</sup> February 2012.

For **April 2010** tenders from eligible Service Providers for a firm Fast Reserve service should be submitted to National Grid as follows:

- By Monday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2010 (business day 1) for multi-month tenders
- By Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2010 (business day 3) for single month tenders
- National Grid will notify Service Providers of the outcome of the tender assessment by Friday 12<sup>th</sup> March (business day 10).

Service Providers wishing to submit a tender should read the Market Information for Tenders from April 2010, which will be published on our industry website by Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> February 2010.
