# Introduction

---

- The Code Administration Code of Practice (CACOP) explains the key points of Proposer Ownership, some of which already exist in the CUSC.
  - Only Proposer can amend their proposal. The Workgroup can assist and advise, but not change the proposal unless Proposer agrees
  - Workgroup may develop alternative 'solutions'
  - Proposer can withdraw proposal prior to Panel recommendation
  - Proposer can discuss legal text prior to consultation
  - Proposal can be adopted by another user if proposal is withdrawn
  - Code Administrators will manage process and documentation on behalf of industry

## Proposer Ownership in the CUSC

---

- Main changes suggested for the CUSC (for discussion):
  - Proposer controls detail of their proposal.
  - Proposer may 'vary' their proposal prior to Industry Consultation
  - After Consultation and before final determination by Panel, Proposer may request a variation from the Panel

## Points to address/discuss

---

- Should the onus on the Chair to make a decision on what progresses be removed?
- Does the Proposer have a say in whether the Proposal is amalgamated with another – and to what extent?

## What are the benefits?

---

- Makes the process clearer and encourages participation and competition
- Removes possibility of Proposal being developed in a way never intended by the Proposer
- Enables original Proposal to be sent to the Authority with an open but controlled environment with the Workgroup
