Introduction

This errata and correction log sets out amendments made to documents and materials published for the Bramford to Twinstead Reinforcement statutory consultation, which runs between 25 January and 21 March 2022. The log includes detail of the original error along with steps undertaken to correct these errors.

1	<p>The East Anglian Daily Times published an incorrect version of the section 47 and section 48 notices in the edition dated 18 January 2022. The incorrect notices included an error in the address of the Hadleigh Library deposit point.</p> <p>It also published an incorrect section 48 notice in the edition dated 25 January 2022, which included an earlier version of the project description and incorrect consultation start and end dates (the publication stated that the start and end dates of the consultation were in the past).</p>	<p>In both cases, the correct notice was supplied to the newspaper, who have accepted that the error was on their part. Once the error was identified the correct versions of the notices were published in the next possible edition of the newspaper dated 21 January 2022 and 27 January 2022.</p> <p>The correct versions of these notices were published in all other newspapers in which we placed adverts and have been available in the Document Library on our project website since the launch of our statutory consultation.</p>
2	<p>Early print versions of the project background document and feedback form were identified to have included a small section of 'temporary 400 kV overhead line during construction' for Hintlesham Woods Option 2.</p> <p>This is an error and there would be no need to undertake any temporary 400kV line diversions at Hintlesham Woods for Option 2.</p>	<p>For detailed plans of the proposals, please see the general arrangement plans which can be found in the Document Library, or on the landowner page of the project website.</p> <p>Digital versions of the consultation materials have always shown the correct version of the plan, and we are in the process of replacing any remaining print copies of the previous project background document available at deposit point locations with an updated version.</p>

<p>3</p>	<p>A small discrepancy was identified in the draft Order Limits between those shown in the general arrangement plans and those shown in other mapping. This included the Preliminary Environmental Information (PEI) Report figures, interactive map on the project website and a number of the consultation materials.</p> <p>An area around the existing 400 kV overhead line north of Twinstead Tee was exclude from the draft Order Limits.</p> <p>The area missing covers an operational requirement to earth the overhead line wires on the existing pylons during removal of the overhead line and pylons to the south of Twinstead Tee. The works would involve light vehicle access to the relevant pylons for trained workers, to enable them to climb the pylons and attach earth lines. The earth lines would be removed on completion of the construction works.</p>	<p>We have updated the interactive mapping and digital versions of the main consultation materials on the website and in any further printed versions.</p> <p>For detailed plans of the proposals, please see the general arrangement plans which can be found in the Document Library, or on the landowner page of the project website.</p> <p>We have not updated the drawings in the photomontage document or PEI Report.</p> <p>Environmental specialists on behalf of National Grid have reviewed the revised draft Order Limits against the PEI Report, and National Grid can confirm that the revised draft Order Limits do not affect the preliminary assessment presented within the PEI Report. The proposed works at this location are minor and are unlikely to result in any new or different significant effects to those presented within the published PEI Report.</p> <p>Using the draft Order Limits as shown on the General Arrangement Plans would change the distances quoted for sites within the study area of the project. The following are noted in relation to the PEI Report Volume 1: Main Report, based on a review of the changes introduced by the revised draft Order Limits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Table 7.4 Line 8 in PEI Report Volume 1: Main Report in reference to Loshes Meadow County Wildlife Site and Essex Wildlife Trust Reserve should state <i>'Approximately 1.7ha of this 8.4ha site is located within the draft Order Limits. Of this, approximately 0.2ha is existing hard standing with the remaining area comprising woodland. The working area within the site will be limited to the existing wayleave and tracks'</i>.

Paragraph 8.5.4 in PEI Report Volume 1: Main Report should state <i>'There are 1,219 built heritage assets identified within the study area'</i>. 5	<p>A proofing error was identified in the Non-Statutory Consultation Report where some internal links within the document had broken.</p>	<p>We have now updated the digital version of the Non-Statutory Consultation Report to include the correct references.
