We are extending our statutory consultation until **11:59pm on Friday 26 July 2024**. We're doing this to give the public, their representatives, landowners and stakeholders additional time and opportunity to have their say and provide feedback on our proposals after the forthcoming General Election, which will take place on 4 July 2024.
